Agenda Item 2 -- Draft Statement for the Press Prior to the Issuance of the Report of the Subcommittee on the U.S. Government's Policy on Nuclear Energy and Related Information Programs

(a) Discussed the draft statement prepared by the U.S. Government on Nuclear Energy and Related Information Programs, as requested by the Board at its meeting of February 10. It was discussed by the Board in connection with the convening of the forthcoming U.S. Government Commission meeting in London scheduled for approximately February 15. After a discussion of suggested modifications, requested that a working group be formed to draft statement, taking into account action reported from the NSC staff on NSC 112 on February 10 and the committee's interest in the statement of the Atomic Energy Commission relating to the effects of atomic bomb detonations. Agreed that the statement be prepared by the working group and referred to the House for possible use in connection with the standing committee report following the release of the AEC report.

(b) Noted that the OCB Working Group on Nuclear Energy and Related Information Programs has been assigned the task of preparing a report on the OCB report to the NSC under NSC 112 in connection with the report on world-wide reactions to the statement of the U.S. Government referred to above.
