The following documents, all classified, appear to be the result of
the investigation of the case, and were obtained from the FBI Laboratory.
A copy of the original report of the laboratory, which had probably exposed the
fallout particles, from the Thompsonless Xavier Report of March 1, 1954. The
original report was not available because it was destroyed by the FBI Laboratory
in the course of their examination of the evidence. A copy of the original
X-ray film, which was taken by the FBI Laboratory, showing the fallout

the released papers. The government has no commercial position in the International Non-
