Second: We have considered in a more expanding the various aspects of radioactive fallout, for example, the probable distribution of fallout, the duration of radioactive fallout, the attack capability, the effectiveness of shelters as protection, the availability of shelter, and the relatively simple measures in order to reduce the effects of fallout.

Third: Considerable knowledge has been gained in the past few years by the military. This knowledge has been applied to the development of emergency and preparedness planning at the Federal, State, and local levels. This knowledge has significantly advanced the knowledge of the general public.

Similarly, emergency preparedness plans for public health, including emergency rehabilitation are under development. These plans are being developed and will be of appreciable aid in the event of a nuclear attack.

The medical, nursing, and other health professions are being actively encouraged to participate in the development of these plans.

Fourth: The Federal Government has provided funds for the development of defense medical supplies and for the development of a stockpile of medical supplies worth procured by the States.
