and stillbirths in the exposed women has been noted since 1950. Evaluation of growth and development data for children has not been completed, so that no additional statement can be made at this time in regard to the previously noted slight retardation of growth in boys exposed at less than five years of age. Preliminary Statement-1965 Medical Survey of Rongelapers

Preliminary analysis indicates that the slight depression of blood elements previously noted has returned to normal.

The people appear to be quite well adjusted to their life on their home island to which they were returned in 1957, and exhibit no untoward psychological reactions to their experience.
