The medical examinations of the Rongelap and Utirik papple vero successfully completed. We find it necessary to bring three new thyroid cases to the U.S. for further examinations and possible surgery; one in the Rongelap exposed group and two in the Utimik exposed group. There vore no other findings of significance (except one case reformed to bolow) and the peoples' health seemed generally good. The three cancer cases from Rongelap were brought to Tripler for examinations and we wave glad that after special thyroid examinations there was no evidence of creater remaining. However, a small growth was discovered in Ellon Deas in the region of the pituitary gland. Since she panted to be with her daughter, Ermita for birth of her child, we could not carry out further examinations then but it is very important that she get specialized examinations in the U.S. and she has agreed to return-possibly with the three thyroid cases. I mention this to you to ask your help in case she should wat fully appreciate the importance of further examinations. When we brought the three ladies to Tripler there was a regretful delay in getting them admitted to the hospital. It seems that a certain paper was not given to us for entrance into the U.S. and immigration held us up a long time and then in spite of careful preparations for admission to the hespitely there was a dolly in getting them admitted. I was most sorry for this and know the lodies were rightfully upset. I was glad we had languing Jacob and Aejon Tins from Rongelap on hand at the hospital to be with tham a good bit of the time.

During our visits to Utirik and Rongelap it was apparent that there was considerable confusion about those oligible for benefits of Public Law 5-52. At Utirik the unexposed people thought that they should be entitled to I.D. Cards and at Rongelup they wanted all the children included. The law and the agreement between ERDA and T.T. states that only the people on our examination list (a copy of which is kept at Majuro) are entitled. This includes exposed Kongelap and Utirik people and the special unesposed Rongelap group of 150 people. Therefore, no unexposed Utirik, only some of the unexposed Rengelap and no child.con are included. We attended to explain this and also that: the unexposed Rongelap control group was established many years ago (1957) and the people on this list were selected to match for age and sex people in the exposed Rongelap group. This group is considered quite adequate for both exposed groups and it has not been considered necessary to have unerposed Utivik people as controls. It should be mentioned, however, that all of these people have the benefit of general medical c re at

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sich call when our doctors are the folinds. With regard to the control group it is ny materiate day, that the Congress of Micronesia included this group for boundate on an informatic for and compensation for participation on the annual comminations.

Another missionception along the people was that the slight vesicual contamination on Respete was the cause of the few thyroid nodules noted in the unexposed Rengelep people (deterly more nodules occurred in the unexposed Rengelep people not living on Rengelep). Attempts were made to explain that the radiologines ("thyroid poison"), that caused the thyroid nodules in the Rengelep people was gone (field out) by 2-3 weeks and so there was none of this "thyroid poison" left then the unexposed people moved there. The level of other radiologines which are not selectively absorbed by the chyroid (as is rediologine) has been for too los to be of consequence in this report.

It was a pleasure having John Haglelgen with us and I an sure he has a much better insight into these problems as a result. He indicated that you may visit the outer islands seen. If so, I hope you will be able to help clarify some of the unsunderstandings. I am advaid some of the people are blaming our medical team for the stipulations of the law and agreement. It was a pleasure coming you in Kajalain.
