3 Marshall Islanders arrive here for radiation growth removal

Two women and a man from Rongelap, one of the Marshall Islands in the Pacific Ocean, arrived here yesterday for treatment of a condition caused by exposure to hydrogen bomb fallout.

They are and reported even though he was in his mid-thirties bomb 36 years ago when the United States exploded the test bomb 125 miles away from the Marshalls.

The three must undergo surgery for removal from thyroid gland nodules caused by radioactive fallout.

They came to Cleveland for the surgery because Dr. William Debyus, associate director of surgery at UH Hospital General, is one of the best thyroid surgeons in the country. They arrived the first to come. Two dozen of their relatives and

neighbors have preceded them.

The United States is paying for the trip. Despite the circumstances, the visit is quite an experience for the victims. One woman who came last year was so fascinated by American women's undergarments, she bought 10 bras, sizes 34 and

Dr. Robert Conard, traveling companion and physician for the Marshall Island residents, said the three making the trip this time get their first view of television. He noted that a highlight of their hospital stay is the television in each room.

Dr. Conard, a 35-year-old radiologist, examined the residents of Rongelap. They have yearly physicals.

The two women will undergo the surgery today while the third will do so tomorrow. The prep period for the surgery is 90 minutes. The operation ranges in size from

a pinkie to a fist and are always multiple, Dr. Conard said.

Of the 10 people on the island when the

fallout occurred, 25 have not had the operation. Usual incidence of thyroid abnormalities is about 4% of a population.
