SUBJECT: Support for Department of the Interior Radiological Survey of Bikini Atoll; DoD Funding Requested (U) - ACTION MEMORANDUM

(U) The Secretary of the Interior letter (TAB A) requests DoD provide a base support ship, two helicopters and airlift in support of a radiological survey of Bikini Atoll and other islands. The Bikini survey is required to enable Interior to avoid disruption of the Bikini resettlement plan, and the potentially serious implications attendant to such disruption. The additional survey of other islands is a longer-range matter.

(U) The enclosed response to Interior presents a workable proposal for the Bikini survey support. It does not include the larger project for the other islands, since the ship is not available for the longer time period. With respect to the Bikini support alone, the cost to Interior on a reimbursable basis would be \$609,000. This aspect has been discussed with Interior and Energy Research and Development Administration (ERDA). Both agencies hold to the position that neither has any funds to pay for the DoD support and that, absent DoD support, no survey can be conducted at this time. The Secretary of the Interior has indicated that failure to conduct the survey could have serious political implications for the United States Government and the Administration.

(C) This brings us to a situation very similar to that encountered in the Bikini cleanup. The Office of the General Counsel then determined that DoD had no existing obligation that would allow use of regularly appropriated funds. It was then decided to use the Contingencies, Defense appropriation, on the basis of the continuing defense interests in Micronesia.

(C) The foregoing rationale for the use of the Contingencies, Defense appropriation is equally valid today (ISA memorandum of 14 December 1968 at TAB B). Therefore, we recommend your approval of the use of the Contingencies, Defense appropriation and the furnishing of the requested Bikini support, with the proviso in the letter to Interior that reimbursement will be required for future operations of this nature. Accordingly, it is recommended that you sign the enclosed letter to the Secretary of the Interior and the memorandum to the Secretaries of Navy and Air Force and Assistant Secretary of Defense (Comptroller).

- 1) Accession number to uniquely identify the document

- 4) Originating organization
- 5) Document type (memo, letter, report, etc...)
- 6) Declassification status (declassified, sanitized, never classified, etc...)
