MIC MIC BANDLAN AGREEMENT

This agreement expresses an understanding reached on this day between counsel for plaintiffs and counsel for defendants in the above-entitled action with regard to the establishment and operation of a medical panel which will plan and oversee all aspects of medical/radiological examinations which will be conducted on all those Bikinians, now residing on Bikini Island or formerly residing there within the past ten (10) years, and desiring examination:

1. On or before November 24, 1975, plaintiffs will send a letter to John deYoung and all counsel of record, setting forth a list of names of scientists and/or medical doctors acceptable to plaintiffs to serve on the panel. The list will also ir-clude, as to each candidate, a description of his title, experience, residence, etc.

26 2. On or before December 22, 1975, defendants will send a
27 letter to plaintiffs which will either accept or reject plain28 tiffs' list:

A. If defendants accept plaintiffs' list, defendants,
in their December 22 letter, will additionally select three (3)
individuals from plaintiffs' list to serve on the panel. In the
event that one or more of the named individuals is unable to
serve on the panel, defendants, in their letter, will also

select three (3) alternative individuals, in order of preference, to serve on the panel.

B. If defendants reject plaintiffs' list, their December 22 letter will indicate which, if any, of those persons named by plaintiffs are acceptable and will also provide a list of additional names of individuals acceptable to them to serve on the panel.

3. If defendants comply with paragraph 2-A, <u>supra</u>, they will supply to the panel on or before January 5, 1976, a factual report containing, but not limited to, a descript available of the medical facilities and equipment on Majuro, <u>a bac Kggpunc</u> history of the individual Bikinians, all prior scientifi and/or medical surveys or reports on Bikini or its people. Ad proposed general budgetary guidelines of the medical example.

4. If defendants comply with paragraph 2-B, <u>supra</u>, <u>para</u>, <u>para</u>, <u>trans</u>tiffs and defendants will negotiate as soon as possible to reach a decision as to the membership of the panel. Within two (2) weeks of this agreement, defendants will supply to the pane the report described in paragraph 3, <u>supra</u>.

5. After studying defendants' report, the panel will issue its recommendations describing the nature, content and scope c the medical examination to be conducted. These recommendations will be subject to the approval of all parties.

8. None of the panel members or alternates will be individuals associated with the Department of the Interior, the Department of Defense, or the Energy Research and Development Administration.

7. It is the strong wish of the plaintiffs that at least one member of the panel will not be an employee of the United States Government.
