Very few small *Scaevola* seedlings in this area around building + bunkers, all other plants usually found appear typical. Collected ~~at~~ *Cochlospermum* seed + plants, *Sida* leaves, *Messerschmidia* leaves, *Scaevola* leaves, *Triplaris* leaves, *Iperia* leaves, *Timberleya* tips (no seeds), + low growing plant we can't remember name of. Rat excreta was present in tubes leading from bunkers. Collected surface + deep soils at three locations in vicinity of larger building + bunkers.

Chopper disabled on Irene while picking up second yard. We sat there until ~ 1920. Then returned to second chopper + got back to Elmer 2005.

Although the vegetation is coming back well - aver-
aging 3 or 4 feet high - it will be several years, I judge,
before there are branches large enough to be suitable
for nesting of species such as White Terns and White-
capped Noddies. In the meantime the small number of
suitable logs or stumps - the majority of which are represented
by the 9 White Tern nests found - will serve as a severe
limiting factor for breeding of the usually most abundant
species, and the White-capped Noddies will probably not breed.

The migrant shorebirds seen - tattler, turnstones,
and plovers, all northern breeders as from Alaska and
Siberia - seem to be finding normal feeding as on the
open ground (of which there is probably more available to
the plovers now than originally) and beach and reef.

Met by Neal Morris, Trust Territory Agricultur-
 alist & most of the council members. Greetings friendly
 & courteous. Conrad talked to Billman, the new magistrate,
 about use of buildings. Billman said OK to go ahead. By this time
 it was time for lunch & we all returned to the ship. In the
 meantime a council meeting was held & the council decided
 that they might not permit the medical examinations.
 A general meeting was called by the council & Conrad
 was requested to be present to answer the questions
 concerning the necessity for the medical examinations.
 In the meantime off loading virtually came to a
 standstill. The meeting lasted over three hours
 & although it was decided that the examinations could
 proceed, several individuals indicated that they would
 not cooperate. Aid was called in for about the last
 hour & help when questions came up about the poisonous
 fish & the matter of the coconut crabs. It turns
 out that the poisonous fish were red snappers caught
 in the northern half of the atoll. Most, if not all,
 finally agreed that radioactivity had nothing to do
 with the poisoning but several were still of the
 opinion that something connected with the events
 of 1954 had some undefined connection with
 the poisoning. This matter is certainly not closed.

are alright for the people to use, we continue to study them. It was explained that although we expected them to remain satisfactory it is desirable to be certain or that it is also desirable to know what changes, if any, might take place. This can be done only by continuing or periodic sampling, it was explained. Actually there did not seem to be any objection to the biological surveys, but rather an asking of questions for information. This opinion was confirmed by Morris.

The rest of the group did some exploring around the island, relocating old sites & checking the condition of the lysimeters (several gallons of leachate had collected). Much clearing of new land is going on for coconut planting. It was not possible to get out the gear & really get to work.

FR, DL, RK & FH to Kabelle by chopper. Collected ground, 5 Fairy Terns. More birds nesting now than in August although there are some White Capped Noddy terns. 5 coconut crabs dug out all males, one had softer than usual carapace although the rest of its skeleton appeared to be as hard as usual (bled the crabs PM - part of blood taken for radiochemistry, part given to Barry Blumberg, NIH for protein analysis). Lurches collected at pits 4 & 6. Pit 4 resampled both by horizons of 1 inch increments. RK & ~~FH~~ checked soil & vegetation types on N half of island. Well water samples taken & water levels measured at previously established well points. Water definitely saltier to taste than last August. Soils are extremely dry (samples taken for moisture determinations).

JK & TJ surveyed on Rongelap I using Japanese bench mark in front of village as zero point. This is a granite marker set in concrete & is marked on the hydrographic office maps as "observation point". Late evening poisoning of seaward reef tide pools with Kinetin & Kinetac. Trip ended at Kabelle for growth studies.

Resurveyed village transect using Redd's compass - alidade compass not functioning & compass previously borrowed from ship proved to be erratic. Soils mapping in vicinity of village. Weather station rewired. More localities collected & some plates checked in condition. Fish dissected & prepared. Mammal trapping brought in Jack, 2 live mackerel, dog teeth, etc. P.R. Walked length of island from S E tip (AEC weather station) to ship - saw crested terns, reef herons (white), in addition to birds previously seen. The herons were inland about 150'. No nests found anywhere along the length of the island. Moisture determinations made at lab. Walker's fertilizer plots observed - no visually obvious differences. Natives have removed 2 or 3 of the *Tacca* clumps. Wine says this was due to misunderstanding. Rain gauges set out in *Lychnis* areas 2+4 to measure interception variability.

Morris showed us damage to coconut trees caused by the beetle, *Braconitissima* (spelling?), & found some of the beetles. Also showed us one grove that is well cared for & has good production. 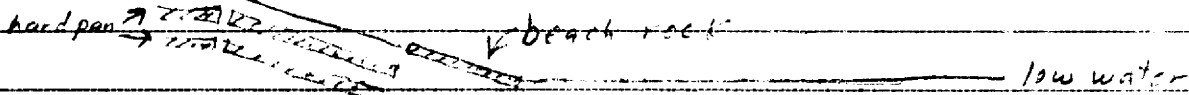
