CPLEATIONS

In a telephone convertation between Colonel Roy W. Melson, Holdquarters Military Air Transport Service and Lt Colonel E. R. Mill r, Cold onling Officer, 2060th Mobile Mosther Squadron on 28 February 1952, it was requested that the 2000th Mobile Meather Squadron college the redicatibility to accomplish an equipment and supply list for the four (4) sutlying weather stations required by Operation "TVY". It was advised that the recommended list of equipment and supplies of ditted by It Colonel Throgataten upon the completion of Operation Providouse, be reviewed when accomplishing the equipment and supply lists for Operation olvin.

On 6 March 1952 the Commanding Officer 2050th Mobile Woather Squadron assigned Capt John O. U. Love, Jr to duty as Special Froject Officer to coordinate all matters, within the squadron, pertaining to Operation "IAX".

The north half of building T-533 (2060th Mobile Weather Squadron special classroom) was selected as Headquarters for the Provisional


Built ing on 14 March 1952 a progress report was submitted to Headquarters, 2009th Air Meather Wing every two weeks. This report was irecoordance with instructions contained in Paragraph 4d(2) of Air Weather Service Operations Plan 4-524, dated 27 February 1952.

From 17 through 19 March 1952, Col Melson, Headquarters, Military Air Transport Service, Lt Col Earney and Capt Sullivan, Headquarters, Air Weather Service, and Col Smith, Lt Col Miller, Lt Col Throgtorton, Maj Braude, Capt Leidesor and Copt Love, Masiquartous, 2059th Air Weather Wing5, altended a conference held by the Commander, Task Group 132.4 at Kirtland Air Force Base, New Munico. The conference was to discuss the following items: Mission and organization of Air Task Group 132.4; concept of operations; personnel and administration to include security, FOM and movement directives, operations, materiel, supply, maintenance, transportation, and budget and fiscal.

Problems to be resolved, in addition to those discussed in the conference notes are: What will be the assignment status of participating personnel during the project period? May personnel alerted for PCS assignments to units of the 2143d Air Weather Wing be utilized on TDY enroute to gaining organization? Can participation on this project regardless of assignment status, be considered as meeting the requirements of an overseas tour, with date of return from project DROS for

Weather equipment used in the project. Recorded accountability for end-items furnished by the 2050th Mebile Weather Squadron to the 2050th Mebile Weather Squadron upon completion of the project.

It was recommended that the officer designated to commend the Air Weather Reporting Unit, Provisional 132.4.3.2 during its overseas phase, be physically present at Tinker AFB to supervise training, supply actions and operations thus arouning that the preparation for overseas movement of the unit is to his ratiafaction.

A letter was received from Headquarters, Joint Task Force 132 on 29 April 1952 regarding Press Speculation and Public Information. The only official press release was a joint release by the Department of Defence and the 'tomic Energy Co riusion on 18 February 1952. Any derial or confirmation of runers or press speculation embounts to an unofficial press release and places the security of the operation in jeopardy.

The authority to perform that portion of tasks apportioned to the 2059th Air Weather Wing in Paragraph 3a (1) and (2), Air Weather Service Operations Plan 4-52, was delegated to the 2060th Mobile Weather Squadron by 2059th Air Weather Wing on 11 April 1952. Copies of correspondence and items contained in 2059th Air Weather Wing file "Project IVI", pertaining to Operation "IVI", were transferred to the

A training directive for Proparation for Cycrocas Movement was received by 2000th Mobile Weather Squadron from Headquarters. Task Group 132.4 on 29 April 1952. Work began immediately on a training program for personnel selected to participate in Operation "IVY".

PERSONNEL

Forsomel required to men Military Air Transport Service Table of Distribution PN-2 were listed by AFSC's indicating the number of persons available within the 2060th Mobile Weather Squairon. This list was forwarded to the 2059th Air Meather Wing requesting the additional personnel. The 2059th Mir Weather Wing elerted and placed ' in a freeze status enough perconnel possessing weather APSC's to man Military Air Transport Service Table of Distribution PW 2. The 2059th Air Weather Wing requested that Masseguerters, Mir Weather Service secure the mucessary non-weather performal. Those personnel were to come from Military Air Transport Service ZI organizations and were to be placed on TDY to the 2050th Mobile Weather Squadron for attachment to the Provisional Element. The personnel would report to the 2060th Mobile Weather Squadron for duty not later than 15 July 1952 and, preferably, as soon as possible.

Additional personnel were requested for the ZI training period in order to have some selectivity of personnel, or in case of an emergency to prevent a shortage.

Headquarters, Task Group 132.4 advised Headquarters, 2060th

A/10 W.L. Mattingly was assigned duties as a clerk-typist with the Special Project Officer on 24 April 1952.

ENUMERUT AD SUPPLITS

From the initial notification of supply respuncibility for Cperation "IVY", tork on the equipment and supply lists progresced rapidly.

The equipment and supply lists suggested by Lt Col Thregreston were reviewed and revised slightly. The Radio Set AN/SED-L with gare parts was deleted and the Radio Set SOR 658 with spare parts was added. The initial lists were submitted in the same marror as the initial lists for Operation Greenhouse.

Upon authisticn of the lists to 2059th Air Weather Wing, the 2060th Mobile Weather Squadron was advised of the form to be used. This necessitated reaccomplish ent of the lists and, due to the uncertainty of the proper security classification, they were classified too highly. This necessitated a third reaccomplishment of the lists. The third list was submitted, in duplicate, to 2059th Air Weather Wing and in thirty two (32) copies, to Headquarters, Task Group 132.4.

Task Group 132.4 requested that Capt John O. U. Love, Jr., Special net Officer, 2060th Mobile Weather Squadron, report to their Materiel Section to review the equipment and supply lists. In accordance with Special Crders 56, paragraph 6, Headquarters, 2050th Mobile

Upon reviewing the equipment and supply lists, it was determined that too very obsolete stock numbers were included. Task Group Director of Natural requested that the lists be reaccomplished, using as many current stock numbers as possible and listing the items with respect to Class Code Numbers instead of Class Numbers.

With Capt Love's return with the above information, the equipment and supply lists were reaccomplished as requested by Task Group Head-quarters, and submitted for supply action. 13

On approximately 15 March 1952 the issue slips for the required' spare parts. 14 for the equipment to be furnished by the 2060th Mobile Westher Squadron, were completed and submitted to Base Supply. This was accomplished by 2060th Mobile Weather Squadron Supply Personnel.
