

The Department of Energy and Its Heritage: The Department of Energy (DOE) is one of the most diverse agencies in the Federal government. It was created in 1977 from a score of organizational entities from a dozen departments and agencies. DOE encourages the development of energy technologies in several areas--solar, geothermal, fossil fuel, and nuclear. It develops technologies aimed at promoting conservation of energy resources. DOE is one of the largest Federal agency supporters of basic scientific research and manages a research complex that includes some of the nation's premier laboratories. DOE helps formulate national policies for energy use and development. Perhaps surprisingly to many, DOE also runs the nuclear weapons research, development, and production complex as well as associated dismantlement and clean up activities.

DOE's nuclear heritage comes from the World War II Manhattan Project which built the atomic bomb. The threads of DOE's involvement with nuclear issues and programs run through the following agencies: the Manhattan Engineer District (1942-1947), the Atomic Energy Commission (1947-1975), and the Energy Research and Development Administration (1975-1977). DOE not only took over functions, cultures, and traditions from these agencies, it also inherited records from them. Of these agencies, the longest lived and most controversial was the Atomic Energy Commission (AEC). The AEC also created a greater volume of records than any other DOE predecessor agency and, not surprisingly, DOE still has custody of a substantial volume of AEC records.

The Atomic Energy Commission: From its inception in 1947 until its abolition in 1975, the AEC carried out a Congressional mandate for a large federal role in atomic energy development. The AEC maintained programs for nuclear weapons research, development, production, and testing; production of plutonium and weapons grade uranium; milling and refining of uranium ore; biomedical research into the effects of radiation and nuclear weapons; basic nuclear research in fields such as chemistry, physics, and metallurgy; development of nuclear reactors; promotion of a civilian nuclear power industry; and conduct of international Atoms-for-Peace activities. It was unique among federal agencies in combining responsibilities to both promote and regulate a technology. It promulgated official regulations to govern the conduct of officials implementing many of these programs.

In 1947 the AEC assumed control of research and production facilities created by the Manhattan Engineer District (MED) during World War II. The facilities were scattered from coast to coast, with the primary ones being located in Oak Ridge, Tennessee; Hanford, Washington; and Los Alamos, New Mexico. The MED operated them through contracts with private universities, such as the University of California, and private companies, such as DuPont and Union Carbide. To develop the atomic bomb, the MED established a complex of production plants and laboratories in which the government owned the facilities but tapped the expertise of industry and universities through contracting out the task of operating them.

The AEC did not change the MED's system of government-owned, contractor operated (GOCO) facilities. To provide government oversight of contractor operated facilities some distance from Washington, the AEC initially created five field centers of operations and gave them broad delegations of authority. Each was to manage a different part of agency programs, and exercised broad authority within limits set by AEC Washington headquarters. Each, however, was to have unusual initiative and freedom of action as long as it operated within general policy guidelines set by Washington.

The Richland Operations Office: At Richland the AEC had to oversee a large plutonium production complex. Initial site construction had started in 1943 and within 2 years an enormous complex was in place. By June 1944 approximately 39,000 workers labored to complete Hanford. By war's end they had built a plutonium production facility consisting of three nuclear production reactors, three chemical separations plants, and other ancillary plants. In accordance with the MED's practice of employing private industry to construct and operate the atomic bomb development complex, E.I. DuPont de Nemours and Company constructed and operated the site.

Because this facility was so large and complex, in 1947 the AEC created a field center of operations whose sole task was to supervise the Hanford plutonium production facility. Called the Office of Hanford Directed Operations, the AEC soon changed its name to the Hanford Operations Office, and, then a decade later, to the Richland Operations Office. The office was located in Richland, Washington, a few miles from the Hanford production site. Unlike some other AEC operations offices, the Office of Hanford Directed Operations supervised activities,

virtually all of which were conducted at one site by one contractor.

By this time DuPont had ceased to be Hanford's prime contractor and General Electric had acquired the managing and operating contract and assumed responsibility for producing plutonium. As well as overseeing site plutonium production activities, the operations office had to ensure a smooth transition from DuPont to General Electric. In this period, facilities, such as the Hanford Laboratories, which conducted research on the biological effects of radioactive material, were also established at the site. One laboratory mission was the study of the effects of radioiodine, which was emitted as a waste product from the chemical separations plants.

Hanford production facilities expanded from 1947 to 1953 to meet Cold and Korean War demands for more nuclear weapons. During this period five additional production reactors were built at Hanford. Thus, the Hanford Operations Office had to oversee a large construction program while it supervised increasingly efficient plutonium production activities. By 1949 approximately 65,000 people lived in the Richland area, and most of them were employed in the plant or at the operations office. At that time the Hanford plants employed more than one-fourth of all contractor personnel engaged in operating atomic energy plants and two-thirds of all construction workers engaged in building atomic energy plants.

By the mid 1950s the operations office was overseeing the operation of eight production reactors at Hanford. The reactors were run around the clock and improvements to the three reactors built during the war allowed them to be run at higher than designed power levels. In the 1960s, one additional reactor, called the New Production Reactor, went into operation at Hanford. It was a dual purpose reactor, designed to produce plutonium and electric power. Like the other Hanford reactors, it was graphite moderated and water cooled.

By the mid 1960s the AEC had met all Department of Defense requirements for nuclear weapons production and had created a huge arsenal of nuclear weapons. Accordingly, President Lyndon B. Johnson decided to reduce nuclear materials production and presented it as a disarmament measure in his 1964 State of the Union address. As a result, over the next seven years, the AEC shut down all Hanford production reactors, save for the New Production Reactor.

At this time the Hanford area was a one industry town. Approximately 8300 people worked either in site plants or in the operations office. Virtually all were dependent directly or indirectly on plutonium production activities. The AEC, accordingly, took steps to keep the area economically viable by undertaking its Hanford diversification program, aiming to bring new industry and contractors into the area. The operations office's major task during the remainder of the decade was to oversee the Hanford diversification program for the AEC.

The AEC moved quickly to implement the diversification program. In 1964 the AEC committed to the use of multiple contractors at the site and selected Battelle Memorial Institute of Columbus, Ohio as one of the first of them. In 1965 Battelle contracted to run the Hanford Laboratories, newly designated as Pacific Northwest Laboratory. The AEC then decided to build the Fast Flux

Test Facility (FFTF), to test fuels and materials which would be used in breeder reactors, at Hanford. Construction of the FFTF began in 1970 and took twelve years to complete. The AEC also located other projects there, such as the Hanford Containment Systems Experiment, designed to investigate aspects of the safety of light water reactors.

In 1975 the AEC was abolished and the Richland Operations Office became a part of the Energy Research and Development Administration (ERDA). Under ERDA the operations office employed 303 personnel to oversee 2272 contractor employees engaged in plutonium production activities. The annual budget for this came to about \$71 million. In 1977, however, ERDA was abolished and the Richland Operations Office became a part of the Department of Energy.

In 1987, several months after the Chernobyl nuclear reactor accident, the New Production Reactor was shut down. The reactor was similar in design to the Chernobyl reactor and safety concerns led to the shutdown. Afterward, most of the site's resources were devoted to managing the environmental legacy left by decades of plutonium production. The Richland Operations Office's job was transformed from overseeing plutonium production to managing environmental clean-up and waste products. It also oversees the research, development, and commercialization of technologies for waste management, clean-up, and environmental restoration. The potential health consequences associated with the operation of the complex was a serious concern among many who live, or have lived, near the site. As a result, Hanford is currently involved in several health related studies and the operations office manages DOE's involvement with these activities.

Richland Operations Office Inactive Records: The operations office retains custody of records created as long ago as the World War II Manhattan Project. This means that it has custody of federal records from a number of operations offices organizations which functioned under the MED, AEC, ERDA, or DOE. Due to the AEC Hanford diversification program, it also has custody of records from several different contractor organizations, among them DuPont, General Electric, and the Hanford Environmental Health Foundation.

The operations office generally controls inactive records on the records box level. Thus, most finding aids to Richland Operations Office records consist of inventories of the contents of individual boxes of records. The inventories appear on Records Transfer Request forms which list the organization which created an individual box of records. The forms, however, do not indicate whether the boxes were parts of larger groups of records retired at the same time.

Originally many of the records about site activities were classified. The Richland Operations Office has now declassified many of its older documents in response to litigation and to meet other needs. It has placed many of these documents in its public reading room; thus much of the contents of the boxes listed on the attached Records Transfer Request forms may be available in the Richland public reading room. Richland Operations Office Inactive Records—Selected Historical Materials: The attached records box inventories list some of the oldest and most important records in the custody of the operations office. They contain key documents about site selection, construction, and production activities under the Manhattan Engineer District and a reasonably complete set of operations office press releases issued between 1945 and 1970.
