script as forwarded to you contained the appropriate information to be disclosed and we requested that the Commission join the Department of Defense in a determination that the information was transmissible. Dr. Libby's letter did not reply to our request and we are, as a result, unaware of the Commission's determination as to transmissibility if such was made or considered.

The time interval between my receipt of Dr. Libby's letter and the scheduled departure of foreign observers to the Pacific Proving Ground left me no choice but to forward the briefing material, as approved by the Commission to the Chief of Naval Operations for use by Dr. Ogle. Nevertheless, I feel compelled to pass on to you my concern that the limited information which will now be given the British and Canadian observers is not in accord with the spirit of cooperation invisioned in inviting them to the operation and may reflect on the possible United States attendance at British test shots.
