1. Publicity with respect to U. S. Disarmament Policy

After discussion of the problem posed by Soviet obstructionist tactics at the London UN disarmament subcommittee talks now underway it was agreed that State would prepare a draft statement for use by the President in the event of a breakdown in the talks which would be cleared with the US delegation in London and various US Embassies with a view to ascertaining the degree of allied and friendly government support for the issuance of similar statements by other chiefs of state. In addition to the foregoing it was agreed that the add tional steps outlined by the USIA representative would assist in clanifying public understanding of the US position.

2. Courses of Action to Achieve a Better Fublic Understanding of the Varying Effects of Sizes and Types of Wiclear Weapons

After discussion it was agreed that the Defense representative would, in conjunction with AEC, present to the working group a unclassified technical statement describing the different sizes and types of nuclear weapons and the different effects caused by their employment.
