The following are a layman's impressions of the hospital at Ponape.

Professional staff

1. 5 U.S. professionals are beginning 2 year terms
 - Pediatrician
 - Internist
 - Ob-Gyn
 - Dentist
 - Pharmacist
2. There is active recruitment for a U.S. surgeon
3. 2 Canadians are on the professional staff
 - GP/anesthesiologist
 - Pediatrician/neurologist/Director of Education (Dr. Steele)
4. 6 Ponapean health officers
 - 5 GP
 - 1 ENT
5. May recruit a nutritionist, also
6. Nursing staff all Ponapean
 - a. 27 TTPI licensed practical nurses, all graduates of 2 1/2 year training; handle patient care, outpatients, OR
 - b. 24 locally trained assistant nurses

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- c. need 20 more nurses in each category
- 7. 1 Medex who counsels in mental health
- 8. Obtain short-term consultants from Hawaii on request
 - Orthopedics
 - Urology
 - ENT
 - Cardiology
 - Ophthalmology

Facilities

- 1. Building is new.
- 2. Built for 116 beds
 - currently is 88 beds
 - 1 wing used for education and training
- 3. 2 OR's -- did not see, but it was stated that the surgeons who have used them are complimentary. Procedures include appendectomy and GI surgery.
- 4. 2 diagnostic x-ray machines
 - 1 old Picker (unknown KVP)
 - 1 more recent Japanese unit (100 KVP)
 - no radiologist at present
 - was told fluoroscopy is available
- 5. Laboratory
 - Have 1 Ponapean chief lab technologist
 - Looking for a U.S. lab technologist
 - "Do a wide variety of tests"
 - CBC
 - stool
 - urine
 - blood sugar
 - blood chemistry
 - liver function tests
 - blood cross matching
 - bacteriological tests
 - etc.

6. Pharmacy

Only pharmacy in Ponape

Supplies not adequate

Presence of U.S. pharmacist should improve

7. Some dietary needs provided for

2. Referrals (about 28/year) go to:

3. People use "traditional" medicine along with modern medicine

Cronkite and Rittmaster, and perhaps others, to visit Ponape to determine whether or not the Ponape hospital could be used as a referral center for at least some level of care which might reduce the number of BNL Marshallese referrals to Hawaii, the Mainland, or Guam.
