

MOTES:

- 1. The above estimated requirements make no provision for additional ships to permit an affort operation at BIKTMI since it is contemplated that personnel will be able to remain on ENYU for all shots. In the event personnel and aircraft must be evacuated, firing will cease at BIKTMI unless the ships at TAONGI are utilized to maintain operations affect. If so, firings would then cease at TAONGI.
- 2. The requirements are based on the assumptions included in this study. For a specific operation, they would have to be restudied and adjustments made accordingly.
- 3. The above do not include the ships, craft or aircraft required by any AFSNP effects projects.
- 4. At TACKET it is felt that there should be two large ships, one of which is capable of handling and providing at least minimum maintonance facilities for helicopters.
