THE UNITED STATES DECLINES TO ACKNOWLEDGE ANY INHERENT SOVEREIGNTY ON THE PART OF EITHER THE PEOPLE OR THE FUTURE GOVERNMENT OF MICRONESIA. THIS RESER-VATION ON THE PART OF THE UNITED STATES MAY YET CREATE SERIOUS PROBLEMS FOR THE NEGOTIATIONS.
