SULL'HOTE LOCATION OF PROVING GROUND FOR AFORIG WEAPORS

Reference is made to your newspandum, subject as above, file MIO (1.2475 of July 30, 1945 in which you request that the comment and recommendation of the Atomic Marry Commission on the above subject be forwarded to the Military Liefson Consittee for transmittal to the Joint Ohiefs of Staff in compliance with the latter's request.

The Atomie Emergy Commission agrees that a continental site may have serials advantages over the Melvetek alte for certain types of tests of atomic veryons. The same of access to a continental site would allow greater flexibility in the preparation for and conduct of these tools and would facilitate the participation of scientific and toohnical people.

The Coumission further agrees that continental operations may he loss expensive logistically than operations at Meivelok; however, the extent of economy effected may be offect to a large degree by the cost of increased safety and security neasures which would be required at a continental site.

Under conditions today, continental operations will obviously pose difficult domestic and penalbly international relations problems; however, the magnitude of these problems could in time change, as in the event of a national exergency.

The Commission therefore considers it desirable that a preliminary study of possible sites be conducted to make possible a nore accurate evaluation of the factors discussed above. At the conclusion of such a study, we shall be in a position to decide whether further action is desirable or justified.
