DATTY INTELLIGENCE ABSTRACTS No. 568.

- 1. LATIN MERICA. Ambassador Kulazhenkov and First Secretary Kazantsev of the Soviet embassy in Maxico City were scheduled to fly to Argentina on Vencuary 27, CIA reports, CII comments that they may be planning to coordinate Soviet efforts in support of Premier Bulgarin's public bid on January 15 for diplomatic and economic relations with Latin America.
- 2. AFGHARISTAN. The HOSE has been shipping some erms and ammunition to if whanistan, the Army Attache in Kabul believes. G-2 comments that this is the first reliable report of such shipments it has received. DIB 1781. Feb 27, 56 page 6, S.
- PRILIPPHES. President Magsaysay has expressed to Ambassador Fermuson his concern over the strong pressure from exporting groups for devaluation and the abandoment of economic controls, and has again requested that the TS provide a top flight personal economic advisor of the caliber of Joseph Codes. Embassy Manila strongly recommends early consideration of this request and notes that the assignment would be very brisf and designed primerily to bolster Magsaysay's self-confidence. - A. JAPAN. The Japanese, especially the fishing interests, are strongly approach to the nuclear tests scheduled for this spring, but realize that there is no hope of having them called off, Embassy Tokyo reports. - 5. ECONOMIC. 1) Actions affecting textile imports and cotton exports. On February 6 the Department of Actions turned down the demestic industry's position for establishment of import quotes on textiles under Section 22, of the Actionizmal Adjustment Act. On February 7, Assistant Secretary of Agriculture Butz took a position against new legislation such as that sponsored by the H.R. 8658, H.R. 8659 and S. 2702 bills which would impose quotes on textile imports on 150% of the 1953-1954 import average. - 2) The Tariff Cormission was split 3 to 3 in its report on fluorspar.
 The President has 60 days from January 18 to decide whether or not to increase the import duty on fluorspar. Italy, Mexico, Srain, Germany and Canada are the countries that will be most affected by the President's decision.
