Robert B. Allen Article on Muclear Matters

- 1. Many of the points raised in the attached article, which was forwarded to me for comment, seem to be in line with the basic facts underlying some of the current mealeur energy projects, although the interpretations may be susceptible of argument.
- 2. For example, "For months the Committee, spearheaded by Cole, has been trying to get a controversial report on the defenses of the country against atomic attack."
