#### DATLY INTELLIGENCY ADSTRACTS OF INTEREST TO WORKING GROUPS

#### 1. Cuba - Dominican Relations

US Embassy Havana has bearned that Cuban President Batista wants the US to take steps to have the Inter-American Peace Committee (IAFC) publicly define its authority and poser, thus demonstrating the error of the official Deminican position regarding the IAFC statement on the recent Guban-Dominican "arms" altercation. The Bominican Government, in a 22 April statement, said the IAFC had considered briefs submitted by both governments, accepted the Cominican position, and rejected Guban charges. The US Embassy agrees with President Datista that either the US Government or the IAFC should clarify the situation. Batista is reported not to favor going to the Fanama meeting of American presidents unless some progress is made on this matter. (US Embassy Havana 439, 23 May, Confidential)

#### 2. Haiti - Protest over Sale of Jets to Dominican Republic

The US Embassy in Port-au-Prince reports that the Haitian Foreign Minister has again protested the sale of sabre-jets to the Dominican Republic. The Embassy notes there is merit in the Haitian view that the Dominicans are over-arming. (US Embassy Port-au-Frince 203, 2h May, Confidential)

#### 3. France - Request for Technical Mission

The French Minister of Defense has urgently requested the US Embassy for authorization to permit a group of French technicians to visit certain US firms and Air Force bases in California in order to study a new flight test system. Equipment for this system has been offered for sale to the French. (US Embassy Paris 5505, 22 May, Secret)

#### h. East Europe - Red Troop Withdrawal Rumored

US Embassy Vienna reports that a New York Times correspondent states he has heard "well founded" remore that the USSR is preparing to withdraw Soviet troops from Hungary, Sumarda, and Bulgaria. (US Embassy Vienna, 2755, 2h May, Confidential)

#### 5. Syria - Recognition of Communist China

In order to persuade Syria not to recognize Communist China, US Embassy Damasons suggests that the Chinese Nationalists approach the Syrian representatives in the UN and possibly other Arabs as well. The Chinese could point out that Syrian recognition of Communist China would result in giving
