FOLDER Greenhouse FALLOUT

Summarized below are the records from previous test operations which have been gathered for transmittal to the Division of Biology and Medicine of the AEC.

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<u>Operation</u>	<u>Records</u>
Trinity	Several hundred exposure sheets. List of laboratory personnel exposures. These two record forms complement each other.
Crossroads	None
Sandstone	List of personnel who received exposures in excess of 100 mr in any one 24 hour period.
Greenhouse	List of laboratory personnel exposures. Photostats of McBee Keysort cards of all personnel involved in the operation with the exception of Program 7 (cloud sampling). Exposures on these cards are noted under remarks in the block marked "Radsafe Physical Exam". In the case of laboratory personnel, an additional exposure due to fall-out was estimated and added to that shown on the card. The original Keysort cards are understood to be in the custody of AFSWP.
Ranger	Master list of personnel exposures with later additions.
Buster-Jangle	Copy of Fred Worman's report and about 2000 original record cards. The lists and cards complement each other. In addition, there is a set of cards which lists the individual and his exposure according to organization.
Tumbler-Snapper	Partial list of personnel exposures copied from master list now believed to be in custody of AFSWP.
Ivy	Master list of personnel exposures with later additions as appendices, and about 2000 original record cards. The master list duplicates the essential information on the record cards. (The Ivy exposures are included at John Servis' suggestion).

There is a remote possibility that additional information on the earlier tests may be available in the dead files of Mail and Records. According to Vi the records on those tests are quite jumbled and it would be necessary to go through about five safes of unorganized material for Sandstone alone.

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Nevertheless, this is a possibility and will be checked at a later date when Pat McAndrews recovers from her present illness and is able to direct the search.

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
