"YARITIME SAFETY BOARD HAS RECEIVED INITIAL REFORTS FROM RABAUL ON CREWS OF TWO SHIPS CAUGHT IN FALLOUT NEAR TRUK ABOUT 100 HILES OUTSIDE DANGER ZONE. ONLY ONE SHIP, TAKUYO MARU, REPORTS EIGH RADIATION READING AUSTRALIAN HEALTH DEPARTMENT OFFICIALS IN RAEAUL TODAY CHECKING BLOOD COUNTS OF BOTH CREWS. SHIPS HAVE REPORTED WHITE BLOOD COUNTS AS OF JULY 18 OF TEN CREW MEMBERS ON MARUYO MARU BETHEEN 2,000 AND 4,000, AIMOST ALL THESE COUNTS FELL 30-40 PERCENT FROM JULY 15 READING TAKEN ON SHIP. CREW NUMBERS ON TARBYO MARU BETWEEN 4,000 AND 4,900.


"AFTER CONFERENCE OF JAPANESE MARITIME AUTHORITIES WITH JAPANESE MEDICAL AND HEALTH AUTHORITIES, MARITIME SAFETY BOARD HAS BEEN ADVISED TO FLY AT MINIMAM 10 AND AT MOST 51 TOTAL GREW MEMBERS EACK TO JAPAN FOR TREATMENT. MARITIME SAFETY BOARD HAS INFORMALLY REQUESTED OUR ASSISTANCE IN ARRANGING FOR FLIGHTS. MSB HAS ALSO DEQUIFICED ADVICE ON METHODS OF DECONTAMMATION FOR TARBYO MARU. THEIR EFFORTS DECONTAMINATE SHIP HAVE NOT BEEN SUCCESSFUL.

"TARUYO MARU HAS WOOD DECK AND CANVASS AUNTINGS BOTH OF WHICH CREW UNABLE TO DECONTAMINATE. TAKUYO MARU REPORTS FOLLOWING ERRATIC SCINTILLATION COUNTER READINGS ON DECK; JULY 15 20,000; JULY 18 15,000.

"MSB MAKING EFFORT TO MINIMIZE PUBLICITY ON WHITE BLOOD COUNT FALL OF CREW MEMBERS IN ORDER NOT ALARM JAPANESE PUBLIC AND FISHERMEN NOW IN PACIFIC. DOUBTFUL THAT THESE EFFORTS WILL CONTINUE BE SUCCESSFUL SINCE PAPERS THIS MORNING ALREADY CARRYING SOME REPORTS.

"EMEASSY RECOMMENDS EVERY EFFORT BE MADE ASSIST JAPAN IN THIS
MATTER; SUGGEST AS INITIAL STEP MEDICAL TECHNICIANS AND EXPERTS
ON DECONTAMINATION BE FLOWN FROM ENGUETOK AT ONCE REPEAT AT ONCE
TO RABAUL TO INVESTIGATE.

"STATUS OF CREW MEMBERS AND SHIPS. IF FOLLOWING THEIR REPORT AND FURTHER REPORTS FROM AUSTRALIAN AUTHORITIES, JAPANESE STILL FEEL DESIRABLE TO FLY SOME OF CREW BACK TO JAPAN, RECOMMEND WE PRODUCE SPECIAL AIRCRAFT.

"THIS IS MOST UNFORTUNATE AFFAIR THAT COULD NOT HAVE COME AT WORSE TIME. AT BEST IT COULD VERY ADVERSELY AFFECT US-JAPANESE RELATIONS IN TERMS OF JAPANESE OFFICION. I THEREFORE FEEL STACUGLY IT IS IMPERATIVE THAT WE DO EVERYTHING WE CAN TO COOPERATE TO THE HILT WITH THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT WHICH IS TRYING TO MINIMIZE HOSTILE REACTION BY ACCEDING TO ITS WISHES."

PARA STATE IS REPLYING TO TOKYO AND CANBERRA AS FOLLOWS:

"AS RECOMMENDED, AEC IS PREPARED TO SEND MEDICAL PERSONNEL
AND DECONTAMINATION EXPERTS FROM ENIWETOK TO INVESTIGATE THE
STATUS OF THE CREW MEMBERS AND THE TAKUYO MARU. THE ENIWETOK
TEAM COULD PROCABLY ARRIVE WITHIN 24 HOURS AFTER NOTIFIED BY
US HQ. EMBASSY TOKYO REQUESTED TO OBTAIN URGESTLY CONCURRENCE
OF THE MSB OR FOREIGN OFFICE TO HAVE US MEDICAL PERSONNEL ATTEND
THE JAP CREWHEN AND THE US TECHNICIANS TO TAKE DECONTAMINATION
INFORM DEPARTMENT AND US EMBASSY
MEASURES ON SHIP IF NEEDED. / CANBERRA SCONEST RESULTS OF SUCH
APPROACH. ALSO STATE DATE FALLOUT TAKUYO MARU CONTENCED. IN
EVENT CONCURRENCE FORTHCOMING EMBASSY CANBERRA REQUESTED TO
OBTAIN LANDING PERMISSION OF PLANE AND OF US PERSONNEL AT
RABAUL."
