

With reference to the request of your historian 16 April on D/O /7 the effects resulting from post-BRAVO developments experienced by Task Stoup 7.4, the following is submitted: D/M a. The contamination experienced from BRAVO shot was of such severity that the Bikini Atoll had to be evacuated and the TARE airstrip COMPT was completely closed. During the period that TARE airstrip was not wailable, surface transportation and PBM airlift was furnished for inter PER SEC island lift. All of the personnel from the Test Support Unit who were stationed at Bikini were evacuated to Enivetok. A special request was Torwarded to Headquarters, USAF for SA-16 aircraft to augment PBM 1114 Other (Place to Bikini. Three (3) SA-16 aircraft were attached for this use in office symboled dition to the Rescue aircraft. & initial): b. With respect to participation of Task Group 7.4 in the first three (3) shots, no adverse effect was actually experienced because of post-BRAVO developments. Because of the evacuation of weather personnel from Rongerik, however, airlift by SA-16 and PEM was required at frequent intervals to take care of Rongerik equipment. Much unforseen airlift was required to outlying islands because of the contamination problem pointed out by the BRAVO mission. c. Colonel Houghton and Lt Colonel Crosby expended a great deal of time collecting all of the information pertaining to Tesk Group 714 participation in the evacuation of Air Force weather personnel from Rengerik. This document will be made a matter of record and will be iscluded in the April history as a completed document. m. All aircraft accomplished their mission satisfactorily with the following exceptions:

- (1) The B-36 control had a broken blister and had to abort and the back-up control B-36 completed the mission including sampling.
- (2) The last 4 F-84 samplers were unable to get samples because of cloud dispersal.
- (3) Two (2) F-84 aircraft were forced to land at TARE strip because of existing emergencies.
