## ENINETOK MARINE BIOLOGICAL LABORATORY

The Division of Biology and Medicine, U. S. Atomic Energy Coumission, announces that the Eniwetok Marine Biological Laboratory is again available for use by scientists for research which can be carried on advantageously on a central Pacific atoll. The laboratory is equipped for all types of biological collecting, ecological, physiological and rediobiological studies. Should investigators submit projects which fall within the interests of the Division of Biology and Medicine, funds may be made available for travel, per diem, and other expenses incurred in the course of the project.

Scientists should submit proposals for research at Enimetok to the Chief, Environmental Sciences Branch, Division of Biology and Medicine, U. S. Atomic Energy Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Only wen may go to Enimetok, and a security clearance is mandatory. Because processing procedures require comsiderable time, proposals for conducting research at Enimetok must be submitted at least three months prior to the expected date of departure.
