

Accordingly, we would like to suggest for the concurrence of the Department of Defense a policy for the control of the film as follows:

- a. That a permanent record be maintained of all persons viewing the film, the record to be initiated with a list of those who have already seen it in Washington, and to be supplemented by subsidiary permanent lists maintained by the responsible custodians.
- b. That there be three prints only of the film in addition to the master copy in permanent storage at Lockout Mountain Laboratory, with the prints in the permanent custody of the ADC, Washington, the Armed Forces Special Weapons Project, Washington, and the Los Alamos Scientific Laboratory. We suggest the AFSPW copy be the existing 35 mm version and that the ADC, Washington and the LSL copies be 16 mm versions.
- c. That a cut version of the present film be prepared, having a maximum classification of Secret - Restricted Data, to be used for training purposes and indoctrination of those persons not having a need to know the complete story of Operation GREENHOUSE.

- d. That further reproduction of this film by Lockport Mountain Laboratory be concurred in jointly by the AEC and the Department of Defense. That responsibility for the review of requests to see the film be specifically fixed by each custodian so that a policy of restricting its viewing to those with a definite need to know on a basis of technical work assignments or policy responsibility can be maintained.

We would be glad to have your comments on the policy here stated and your concurrence therein if the policy is acceptable. We believe that training and orientation in the problems of atomic testing can be accomplished adequately by the use of other films already in existence or to be prepared, all of which bear a lower classification and contain much less sensitive information on the weapons program.

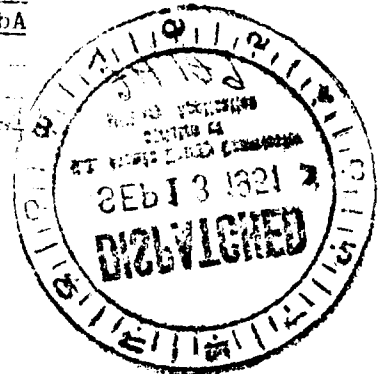
