1. In accordance with GIEGPAC Secret letter, merial GO24, dated 13 Janwary 1954, it is the responsibility of GATM 7 to advise OIECPAC of special hazards involved in the GATMIX tests and appropriate presentions required to iscure mafety of inhabitated islands within the purview of the Provise Command, ether than Joint Task Force SEVEN. Prior to the first detenation of Operation CLETIX it was not anticipated that execution of any stell would be required. When it became knows that Nongelap and Utirik had become radiologically conteminated, time did not permit notification of CIECPAC and employment of CIECPAC forces for the execution. Commander Joint Task Force SEVEE, having the only available means for an immediate execution. accompliant the standard with task force ships and delivered the inhabitants to Naval Station Kwajalein. When the execution the Commander, Faval Station Funjalein has furnished housing, subsistence and medical same for theme personsel. CJTP 7 has rendered all popsible appletance.

2. It is assumed by GUTF 7 that CIECTA' will assume responsibility for the return of the inhabitants of these stalls to their homes when much action becomes possible. Frior to their return, certain actions will be required to insure that their mormal way of life can be remmed. In planning such action, the fellowing factors should be evasidered: BEST COPY AVAILABLE

a. Inhabitants of these two atolle cannot be returned to their homes until Operation CASTLE is concluded. The Utiris inhabitants, as far as radiological and hea'th conditions are concerned, can be returned immediately after any possible danger from the last CASTLE detonation is passed. The inhabitants of Rongela will require further medical observation and the atoll will require further survey before a definite date of ret re can be determined.

b. Livesbook and personal property such as copra, rice, flour, etc., which has been damaged or destroyed abould be replaced. It is possible that arrangements can be made to have this accomplianed by HICONTERPACES. Some of the mainals of both stolls have been next to laboratories in the U.S. for acismtific study. It will probably be necessary to destroy livestock remaining on

Rongolap. Livestoor remaining on Wirik will probably not need to be destroyed.

e. Examination will have to be made of the abolis' water supply. Opterms will either have to be made radiologically clean or replaced and filled with fresh water.

d. This command is presently engaged in determining the future edibiity of fish, eccentis, pandamus, and other regulation which is used for food. The results of these studies will be made available as some as they are known.

a. Burveys of houses, sleeping mate, etc., vill have to be made to determine the degree of retained radiological contamination, if any. Areas found to be radiologically unsafe vill have to be decontaminated. Houses, if any, found unsuitable for further ecoupancy vill have to be replaced prior to re-entry.

5. The above are considered only primary planning factors. It is recommended that a survey of these atells be conducted by CINGTAG in the near future to determine the action to be taken prior to and during the re-unity of the inhabitants.
