

2. ALTHOUGH EARLY IN THE DAY IT APPEARED WE WIGHT RIDE OUT THE STORM, BY MID-AFTER NOON OG SAMTEC HAD ORDERED PREPARATIONS FOR FULL EVACUATION. EVERY EFFORT WAS MADE TO SECURE CPITICAL EQUIPMENT IN BEST AVAILABLE SHELTER. FULL EVACUATION WAS ACCOM-PLISHED JUST SHOPT OF FULL DARKNESS AT 240730Z (MONDAY EVENING 7:30 P.M. LOCALD. INCLUDED IN EVACUATION WERE ALL PERISHABLE SAMPLES AND DETECTOPS REQUIPING OR YOGENIC SUPPORT.

3. EVACUATION WAS BY C-141 CARGO-CONFIGURED AIRCRAFT TO KWAJALEIN. ONE-HUNDRED THIRTEEN (113) PASSENGERS WERE SEATED STRAPPED TO CARGO PALLETS. ARRIVED KWAJALEIN 240900 (9:00 P.M. LOCAL). KWAJALEIN MISSILE RANGE HAS PROVIDED ALL REQUESTED SUPPORT AND COOPERATION.

4. TYPHOON OLGA IS NOW EXPECTED TO PASS IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO ENIWETOK APPROX 242300Z (11:00 A.M. TUESDAY LOCAL) WITH 60 KT WINDS, 90 KT GUSTS.

5. SANTEC IS CURRENTLY ATTEMPTING TO ARRANGE FOR A FLYOVER RECONNAISSANCE AS SOON AFTER PASSAGE AS POSSIBLE. SHOULD IT SHOW A CLEAR USABLE RUNWAY WE WILL ATTEMPT TO USE SCHEDULED MAC SATURN OCTOBER 25 FOR GROUND RECON AND, IF POSSIBLE, REENTRY. SHOULD LIFE SUPPORT SYSTEMS BE INOPERATIVE WE WILL REMAIN ONLY BRIEFLY AND RETURN KWAJALEIN TO REGROUP.

6. AT LAST REPORT (240600Z) PALUMBO WAS DEPARTING ENIWETOK AREA SOUTHWARD TO WAIT OUT STORM PASSAGE.

7. OUT POST-RECONNAISSANCE MESSAGE WILL PROBABLY BE FILED NO EARLIER THAN 260600Z.

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
