DRAFT ANNOUNCEMENT BY JTF ON WEATHER SERVICE RETURNS

The following announcement has been reviewed by the Chairman and General Manager for issuance by the Commander, Joint Task Force SEVEN after arrival of the weather service personnel at Tripler General Hospital, Honolulu. It is our opinion it would be preferable to use the announcement in response to inquiries rather than as an across-the-board announcement to all media.

The Chairman and General Manager have no objection to the following text:

"Thirty-one enlisted men of the Army, Navy and Air Force who were exposed to moderate amounts of radiation during the H-bomb experiments at Bikini at March 1 have been returned to Tripler General Hospital, Honolulu, T.H., for medical processing prior to reassignment. Despite the fact there is nothing apparently wrong with the men, they are being given complete medical examinations prior to return to full military duty."

"Although none of the group has experienced any symptoms of radiation illness, they have been under close observation ever since their exposure last month."

"The 236 native residents of the islands nearby the Pacific Proving Ground area are remaining on Bangajala for further observation until they can be returned to their homes after the tests. No permanent harm to any of them is expected as a result of their exposure."

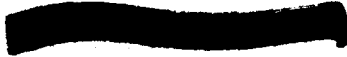
It is suggested that publication of the names of the enlisted men being returned to Tripler may result in pressure from town newspapers and wire services for individual stories and/or interviews on the men's experiences on an uncontrolled basis.

The paragraph referring to the Japanese fisherman has been eliminated because this is an information matter for which the Department of State is responsible and involves relations between the Japanese and United States government.
