Dear Admiral Burke:

It is a pleasure to report that the sixth follow-up medical examination of the Marshall Islanders has been successfully completed and the personnel of the team are preparing their data for publication.

Preliminary analyses of their data indicate that no untoward clinical effects have occurred in the population although there has been a slight increase in the body burden of certain radioactive materials.

Dr. Robert A. Conrad, Leader of the team, has written that Mr. G. R. Linschier USN, Commanding Officer of the USS NIMITZ (CVN 68), and the officers and crew of the ship supported in every way possible and contributed greatly to the success of the expedition.

Dr. Conrad has also asked me to note the outstanding assistance rendered the team by several other Navy personnel. Commander J. V. King (USC) has served as a most effective Navy liaison officer in the Washington area. Captain C. F. Van der Hoeven, Commanding Officer of the Naval Medical Research Institute, supported the station to the fullest and at Hawaii, Captain Harry Ester (USC) USN was a most efficient liaison officer to the Commander-in-Chief of the Pacific Fleet. At Beaupreia the Commanding Officer, Captain Alfred L. Cole USN, cooperated in every possible way and particularly in securing the air support of the Canadian Air Force. Commander J. E. Major (USC) USN, the senior medical officer at Beaupreia, was also extremely helpful.
