1. AEC 226/79 - Draft Letter to Mr. Stassen Commenting on Disarmament Study - Approved, as revised. (Foster)

Mr. Foster suggested that Mr. Strauss ascertain whether the recent State position on test moratorium reflects Messrs. Dulles' and Hoover's views. (Mr. Strauss)

2. AEC 787/24 - Joint AEC-DOD Information Plan for Operation REDWING - Approved. The Commission also approved declassification of the approximate shot date. (Salisbury-Marshall)

Letters to the press are to indicate the reasons for limiting accommodations. (Salisbury)

3. AEC 903 - Action in the Field of Atomic Energy to Encourage Integration of the Community of Six - Approved, as revised and subject to the individual Commissioners' review before dispatch. Mr. Murray's comments are to be obtained. (Hall)

4. AEC 603/28 - High Energy Accelerators on University Sites - Approved. Mr. Strauss indicated his concern over the possibility of large over-runs. (T. H Johnson)
