1. AEC 903 - Action in the Field of Atomic Energy to Encourage Integration of the Community of Six - Approved, as revised. Mr. Hall has been requested to obtain your comments.

The revised version of this paper has been circulated as AEC 903/1, and after review by the Commissioners, will be forwarded to the Department of State on April 10.

2. AEC 226/79 - Draft Letter to Mr. Stassen Commenting on Disarmament Study - Approved as revised. Mr. Foster suggested that Mr. Strauss ascertain whether a recent Department of State position paper on the question of a test moratorium agreement reflects Messrs. Dulles' and Hoover's views. Your memorandum of March 26, 1956, on this subject will be incorporated into the record.

3. AEC 787/24 - Joint AEC-DOD Information Plan for Operation REDWING - Approved. The Commission also approved declassification of the approximate date of the first shot.






